

# Going on a Book-nic



Take your kids on a literacy themed picnic and encourage reading together while you enjoy the great outdoors.

## Before You Go:

### 1. Work with your child to make sure you have the items you'll need to be comfortable. Some ideas are:

- a. Put together a healthy lunch or a **variety** of snacks to enjoy while you are at the park.
- b. **Assemble** a few things for your trip like a blanket and hats, visors, or sunglasses to protect your eyes (direct sunlight can be very bright for reading).
- c. Don't forget to bring and **apply** sunscreen!

### 2. Pack your book-nic basket!

- a. At home or at the library, find park- or nature-related stories.
  - i. Find one or more books to read together in addition to books for your kids to read on their own.

- b. Bring along a few tools for your trip.
  - i. Pencils or washable pens
  - ii. Paper or a notebook

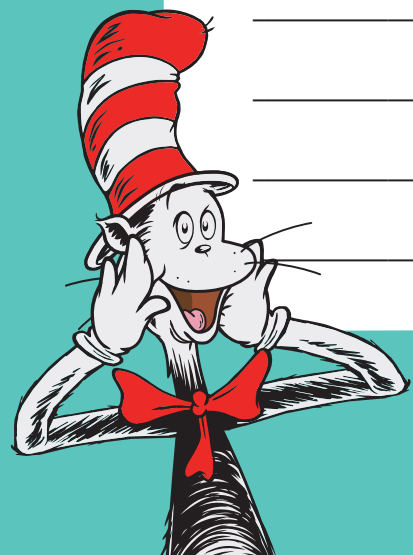
